1. Human Resource development

<u>GP Ward member meeting</u>: On 13-oct-16 conducted and facilitated the ward member's meeting on planning of the budget, identification and prioritization of works to be taken up by Gramapanchayath. The sarpunch, ward members, village secretary and APMAS representatives attended the meeting. Following are the resolutions taken by the members:

- 1. Cleaning of drainage regularly by sanitation staff and proper supervision.
- 2. Putting on/off buttons to street lights to minimize the GP electricity bills.
- 3. Construction of 8 CC roads with in the layout of village.
- 4. Construction of 6 side drains in identified places.
- 5. Giving Demand notice to APL on Tax payments (2015-16).
- 6. Tightening the electric wires upon houses by laying new polls.
- 7. Hike in GP staff salaries.
- 8. Payments to IHHL sanctioned bills.
- 9. Request APL to construct village welcome board and Bus shelter at Road.
- 10. Exposure for ward members to Ibrahimpur village.

Grama Sabha : Facilitated Gramasabha on APL -APMAS model village works done up till now. The major issues raised by community regarding bad maintenance of sanitation and the functioning of GP Secretary.

We have identified the places for the wall paintings on moral quotes in the village with the help of the GP. In this Gramasabha, about 45 villagers, sarpanch, 4-ward members, village secretary, ANM, Anganwadi Worker and APMAS staff participated. A lot of questions were raised on GP income and expenditures for the year, which shows the participation and awareness of the people about their money. Some farmers did some disturbance on the issue that the water polluted by APL has come in to their fields and did heavy damage to their crops.



1.1 VDC member meeting: On 21-oct-16, a VDC meeting was organised at grampanchayath premises. In this meeting, P.Srinivas -President taken a lead role to facilitate the agenda of the meeting and from MAS-HO, Project Manager – Mr. B.Venkateshulu also joined the meeting to review and supervise the meeting agendas. Total 14 VDC members attended the meeting. The following were the points of agendas discussed and resolutions taken by the VDC after the meeting:

- Review of the last meeting resolutions- Discussion on pending issues like place for the health center and anganwadi centre.
- Exposure visit for the VDC members to Ibrahimpur- On date 21st -Oct-16.
- Exposure visit of the Gaudium school children to primary school- Borpatla fixed for 19th -Oct-16.
- > Orientation program to Lactating and Pregnant women on health and nutrition-On 26th -Oct-16.
- > Utilization of dust carry rickshaws through Grampanchayath- requested.
- > Taking of VDC resolution in CSR works in the village.
- Requesting APL to take up another developmental activity requested by VDC in the place of construction of the additional class rooms at the high school.VDC decided to request local MLA for the funds to construct additional class rooms.
- Construction of IHHL through the VDC identified person or agency.
- Collection of Adhaar cards of the immigrants came from outside and staying in village.
- Requested APL to take up the following developmental activities.

-Sanction and fitting of the LED bulbs to street lights to reduce the electricity charges of village-

Approximate number -150

-1000mm CC lining work for distribution channel of irrigation tank in the village

- Construction of Bus stand and 'welcome' common at the entrance of the village
- CC roads in the village
- Identification of place for PHC- Demolition of old grampanchayath building and construction of PHC.

Exposure visit of VDC to Ibrahimpoor:

Introduction

On 21.10.16, we have organized an exposure visit to Ibrahimpur model village,Siddipet (M & Dist) with 27 participants including the Sarpanch and ward members along with MAS staff(B.Venkateshulu -Manager,B.Venkatswamy-PO) and GP staff. Reached Ibrahimpur at 10:30am and interacted with Mr.Yeallareddy and team to know about the village and developmental activities.

Village profile

Ibrahimpur is located 15 KMs distance from the Siddipet-Dist towards the mustabad road.Village is having 267 households with 1120 population and the main source of livelihood is agriculture.This village is adopted by Irrigation minister Mr.Harish Rao and and the village transformed itself as a model with the cooperation of village sarpanch-Lakshmi and youth members. The villagers have dug sink ponds, grown trees and built toilets in the process of making their village clean and green.

In the village, every house has a water conservation pit. Mr. K.Yellareddy, the son of Sarpanch K.Laxmi yadamma played a significant role in transforming the village into a model. This small village however should be an inspiration for other villages to strive towards development. It's cleanliness maintenance made the village an ideal to the other villages in Telangana state. You won't find any garbage strewn around anywhere. One cannot even find plastic covers and pet bottles and have clean lanes all over the village and everyone in the village is following good sanitation practices realising their responsibilities towards the village. This cleanliness maintenance resulted in good health status of all in the village. The village has not reported any viral fever cases for the past several months. The sanitation drive is now become the regular practice for everyone.

Activities VDC members got exposure in the village:

1. Model Government school- Beatification with plants, separate toilets for girls &boys, wall writings, hygienic practices-hand wash, Digital class room, 100% enrolment of village children.

- 2. Hygienic conditions around bore wells
- 3. Good drainage maintenance practices
- 4. Avenue plantation to all roads in the village along with the safe tree guards-Village beatification
- 5. 5-10 Plants in every house.
- 6. Mini park in the village
- 7. Safe drinking to every HHs through RO water plant

- 8. Tap connections to every house hold with meter
- 9. Drainage water conservation pits
- 10. Toilets for every house hold
- 11. Installation of Solar street lights
- 12. Solar system establishment in 25 households-Home purpose
- 13. Dump yard outside the village-segregation of wet and dry dust with recycling practices.
- 14. Clean and green CC roads.
- 15. LED bulbs in every house hold
- 16. Farm pounds in every farmer agriculture fields under NREGS
- 17. Solar pump sets with subsidy component.

Learning of exposure

- 1 Providing enough water for the domestic needs of village-house holds
- 1. Villagers have to take the ownership of developmental activities.
- 2. Underground drainage will not solve the problem of sanitation.
- 3. Unity of Villagers beyond political parties.
- 4. Youth involvement in development.
- 5. Tapping of all government schemes to meet needs of village.
- 6. External linkages for resources mobilization- MLA/MP funds, CSR funds and corporate.
- 7. Holding of baseline data for the coverage of all vulnerable sections in the village.
- 8. Behavioural change in maintaining clean and green environment at community level.
- 9. Supply of live stock for additional income generation.
- 10. Dedication of village leaders and youth towards development.
- 11. Commitment of local leaders and MLA
- 12. Good leadership with right approach.

RO plant income and expenditure: By discussing with GP staff and plant operator, the ATW cards were verified and income and expenditure statement of plant from May-16 to Sep-16 was prepared.

Operational Maintenance: By discussing with RO plant operator, purchased the cleaning material like Bucket, mug and sweeping wiper and paid salaries to the operator.

3. Health Improvement

Health Vaccination camp: On 5th -Oct-16, a health camp was conducted by the Health department staff. The orientation to pregnant and lactating women on health precautions was given. In total 23 pregnancy women and 22 lactating women attended the orientation. The ANMs -Smt.Balamani and Smt.Umarani and Asha workers were present in the program. After the program, we have finalized the date for orientation program to pregnancy and lactating women I.e.26.10.16.



Orientation program to pregnant and lactating women: On 26th-Oct-16, by coordinating with Azimpremji foundation staff who is working on Anganwadi education and ANMs/Asha workers of the village, we have conducted a health orientation camp for 20 lactating and pregnant women in the village. In this orientation program, local sarpanch and VDC president came as special guests and ANMs, Azim premji staff and MAS staff, Mr.Venkatswamy and Miss.Sujata acted as facilitators and resource persons for the orientation program. We have tried to cover the following topics through this program:

- 1. Arogya laxmi scheme- Anganwadi services
- 2. ANM services in the village- Enrolment of the women and providing health cards
- 3. Importance of the institutional delivery-High risk pregnancy cases.
- 4. Regular health checkups-weight, BP, TTs, Iron tablets etc.
- 5. Intake of healthy food- Fruits, pulses, Meat, fish
- 6. Enrolment of the children (1-5 years age) in the Anganwadi centres for pre primary education.

7. Check up of children under Rastriya Bala Swasta Karyakram (RBSK) under National Rural Health Scheme.

Genaral health check up to Primary and high school children under RBSK, NRHM

Under the National Rural Health Scheme, a health check-up was conducted for all the children of Borapatla High School and Primary School. The doctor conducted the general health check up on 19th Oct-16 on thirty common disease and prescribed tablets, treatments and recommendation for the Mandal hospital to the children as per their health status. MAS has collected the list of the students who are in serious condition and has a recommendation to see and get admitted in the Mandal hospital to follow up the status with their parents.

4. Sanitation improvement

According to the resolution of grampanchayath, sanitation staff cleaned the drainage and removed the bushes around the drains to maintain clean environment and cleared the bushes with tractor – blade in some parts of the village.

The primary school ground was cleared with the blade tractor to make the ground beautiful. In the high school, with the motivation of SMC- Chairman, Smt Padma, we sprinkled the round off-chemical to destroy the bushes.

5. Education

Gaudium School twining program:

On 19-Oct-16, we have organized the visit of the students and teachers from the Gaudium school to the Primary school- Borpatla under our School Twining Program. In this exposure visit, 25 childrenn along with 3 teachers came from the Gaudium School -Kovur- Hyderabad. Borpatla local sarpanch Smt.Veena Vijaya Basker Reddy and VDC members came as special guests for this twining program.

Timings of events

- teachers and students interaction 10:30 am to 11:00am
- Children peer learning/cross learning 11:00 am to 11:45 am
- Cultural activities-songs, sports activities-11:45 am to 12;30 pm
- Departure to Hyderabad 12:30 on wards

Gaudium school children and teachers did transact walk around the school to know about the infrastructure ,learning material available in the school. Miss.Pooja coordinated the twining program from Gaudium school and Miss Teena along with two other teaches participated in the event. From the Primary School, HM- Smt Amruta ,Mr.Diwakar, Smt Laxmi, Mr.Pochaiah facilitated the children's interactions. From MAS Miss.Sujata, Project officer and Venkatswamy coordinated the program and explained about the need of twining program.

MAS is working on the proposal to carry out the other activities through School Twinning Program in a systematic way and have a long term collaboration with the Gaudium school to make this plan sustainable.

Orientation class to Anganwadi teachers:

With the tie-up of Azimpremji foundation, conducted demo class to anganwadi teachers in Anganwadi centers of Borpatla. In this demo class, Azimpremji Foundation staff Mr. Koteswar Rao and Mr.Bharath facilitated the class. Azimpremji foundation have taken Borpatla two anganwadi centers as pilot of their project based at sangareddy cluster. The staff will visit the centers weekly twice and support the teachers in pre primary education of the children.

6. Infrastructure Development

Primary School Compound wall construction: Primary school's compound wall gap filling with cement bricks work is completed. Also, the 1st coat of the cement on the compound wall from both the sides is finished. The following works are under progress.

- > Two class rooms flooring completed with Tandur stone and remaining need to do.
- Anganwadi centre flooring with stones.



From APL-Unit-1 civil head came and checked the quality of work and given particular suggestions to contractor on using the sand and stones lying. Mr.Kumarswamy Civil engineer visited the school and given some inputs on quality of work and suggested to do water curing regularly.

7. Other Development Activities

Plantation: In order to protect the Plants from damage which were planted under NREGS, we have conducted one survey on the survival of the plants at school, avenue plantation and farmers fields.
